



Hedges, Wildlife, Farms and Government – John Calder

Green Martinstown World Renowned Supper Evening. Well perhaps not world renowned but nevertheless developing a formidable reputation for the high quality of supper!

Our quest speaker will be John Calder, Project Manager of the Dorset Climate Action Network's project The Great Big Dorset Hedge (GBDH). John will be speaking about the critical importance that hedgerows play for wildlife habitats and mitigating against climate change, whilst at the same time allowing space for farming and the essential production of food. The surveying of hedges, now taking place in Martinstown and elsewhere across Dorset, is an essential first step in assessing hedges for the Sustainable Farming Incentive – part of the soon to be introduced **Environmental Land Management Scheme** (ELMS). John will talk about how the GBDH scheme works and how we liaise with farmers. John is part of the team working on hedges for DFFRA.

Citizen Science Project The River

Winterbourne, is now being tested every month, from its source in Winterbourne Abbas to West Stafford, where it joins the River Frome, by our team of volunteers. There are 10 testing sites and each is tested for phosphates, turbidity (solids in the water) and temperature.

Streets Alive - Car Free Day - 22nd September 2023

International Car Free Day is on Friday 22nd September. Organised by Dorchester Transport Action Group some streets in Dorchester will be car free and in the Charles Street car park adjacent to Waitrose there will be fun activities for the whole family. This is an opportunity to inform people about the harmful impact of cars and car pollution and to mobilise people to take back control of their own urban environment.

The cycle path to Maiden Castle Road has been resurfaced. Making cycling to Poundbury and Dorchester very safe. It only takes15 minutes to Poundbury, 20 minutes to Dorchester – and you get fitter at the same time. Can't get any better than that!

Winterborne St Martin PARISH COUNCIL

Some time ago I mentioned moves regarding what was originally known as the Memorial Hall, and later as the Reading Room or Parish Office. In essence those who had taken on Trusteeship had tired of it and sought to pass it to the Parish Council. In some ways this would be passing it back, as the few documents retained show that the management and finances were intermingled in the 90's, something which eventually caught an auditor's eye and led to a parting of the ways.

Now we are exploring methods of bringing this building back to something near to the original intention, a facility of service to the Parish. We are starting at first principles and have engaged lawyers to advise on whether we might legally take ownership in trust, and on our best method of establishing a title given that the original indenture (on vellum no less) was 1915, and the trust was established in 1922 with a copy of that document held in the National Archives.

I said "something near" the original intention as one of the four clauses is partially unreadable, and the others are very much focussed on men rather than having any sense of equality. I do actually feel that Clause 2: "For the benefit of those who are serving or have served in the Forces of the Crown" has merit, but I might be biased, and I feel we will be looking for room to generalise in favour of today's Parishioners. But, step one is discovering whether we can actually have anything to do with it. We have established a Working Group to see the process through and there is no reason why this cannot include anyone who has an interest in seeing this building brought back into community use. Indeed from my position outside the Working Group I'd welcome wider involvement – please do get in touch if you think you can help.

Other than that the main news is my oft repeated please for people to come forward to serve as Councillors. Whilst there is little to commend it, and as we are now down to 7, one of whom will be away for a number of months, what little power we have is vested in very few people. This is not necessarily the best way to ensure we that balance decisions on behalf of the various interests of the constituents of our parish.

The **MILEATERS** out and about...

Despite a forecast of 70% chance of rain, an intrepid group of 14 Mileaters plus three dogs set off for the Woolsbarrow carpark, Wareham forest for the start of a walk led by Gerald and Rosie Duke.

The route took us to Woolsbarrow fort, the smallest hillfort in Dorset; not a difficult stroll to reach the top and once there one could see why its commanding views

over the western end of Poole harbour would have been so important. We carried on along the St Edward Way – so named after the processional route taken for carrying King Edward's body from the priory at Wareham to the abbey at Shaftesbury. King Edward I (also known as Edward the Martyr) reigned for about 3 years and was murdered in 978 in the market place at Corfe Castle, apparently by his stepmother, he was probably about 15 or 16 years old.

The route crossed the A35 in two places and we were safely seen across this fast road by Gerald wearing his hi-viz jacket (bought especially for the occasion!)

The rain didn't materialise and on our return to the carpark, we drove to The Silent Woman pub for a well earned lunch after a 5.3 mile walk.


