



THOUGHTS FROM THE DESK of... a parishioner

For some people September is a time for beginnings. There will be members of our community who will attend school for the first time in their lives. Those a little older may be starting at a new school. For yet others a new school year will begin without their attendance as they go on to higher education or enter the world of work. Even for some of the more mature members of society there may be new challenges to face this month.

The churches in the benefice of the Winterbournes and Compton Valence will be welcoming a new vicar. The official welcome will take the form of a service known as the 'Installation' of the new incumbent. This service will be held in St Martin's church in Martinstown at 7.00 pm on Wednesday 4 September. The new team vicar, Revd. Teresa Stewart-Sykes will be asked to declare her willingness to undertake the duties required of her in the office to which she is appointed. Teresa is joining us from Dorchester-on-Thames where she has been responsible for five village churches, but previously held the post of an assistant priest in Dorset's Dorchester. Although she will be taking up a new challenge, she will be working in an area of which she already has some knowledge.

During the last year during the period of the 'Vacancy' oversight of the benefice has been undertaken by the team rector Revd. Keith Magee and both he and curate Heidi Merrett have conducted services regularly. The PCCs of the benefice parishes have also been grateful to several retired priests and lay preachers who have ensured that there has always been someone to lead worship in our churches. Within the parishes there have been many members who have contributed a variety of skills for which many thanks are due. In the weeks ahead there may be changes as we look forward to furthering the mission of the church which Christ encouraged all believers to engage in. We look forward to welcoming Teresa, and her husband Jon, among us and to her presence and her ministry in both our parishes.



Update from myself Cllr David Hutchings. Having been on the council for over a year now, I think I have got to grips with being a councillor. I have taken on the following roles: Budget Committee, Staffing Committee, Reading Room working aroup and most recently the role of Vice Chair. Being part of the Budget committee involves us meeting separately to the full council meeting. We then draft the budget around Oct - Nov time and after a few headaches, corrections, and much needed glass of something. It would be the presented to the full council to debate and allow them to question the thinking behind our thoughts. This also includes deciding the precept for the following year. The main costs for the council are the Clerks wages, stream clearance and grass cutting. This is accessible under finance on the Council Website.


Dorset Greener Homes 14th/15th and 21st/22nd September 2024

The first a "quiet celebration" at home and the second a celebration to take place on the village green on Saturday 31 August commencing at 13:00.

Prior to 13:00 our bellringers will accompany the setting up by performing a quarter peal for Ken, led by Howard Bowering.

Ken liked to take a deckchair & fish & chips to the village green to watch the world go by. One day he commented that it would be lovely to listen to a silver band whilst there, & so the seed was sown for his 100th Birthday.

The Dorchester Durnovaria Silver will arrive to play three sets of approx 40 mins each from 13:15 so please bring a deckchair or rug and join us.

The green is a public space and this is NOT a private event. Sit alone if you prefer, sit with your family & friends, we won't mind, but please come along and listen, dance if you wish!

Ken was in the RAF from 1942 to 1982, starting as a Flight Engineer in WW2 flying Lancasters, later Vulcans, Nimrod's, in fact trialling & testing over 30 different planes. He also lectured in flight engineering, quite a RAF career.

Ken is a member of the Association of Air Engineers, & some members he taught will be making long journeys to share the day with him. In acknowledgement of his service & milestone birthday, the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight Lancaster will make a low pass over the village if weather allows.

It's timings have changed a couple of times, we are now looking between 14:15 -14:45.

We would like villagers & friends to stand & form the letter E as a thank you, as it passes over. The roar of 4 Merlin Engines is going to make some noise, villagers & pets be prepared ! Sqn Ldr Jim Stokes is the Lancasters Flight Engineer for this flight, a fellow association member. My sincere thanks to him, his crew & "Moose" the associations chair for helping me make this happen.

Should it rain on the day, the band will perform in the village hall, please still join us, we can dash out to the Green from there to form the "E" for the Lancaster crew to see.

Should the inevitable occur & Ken sadly departs for the "blue skies", his orders are to put his photo on a deckchair with a glass of whiskey, EAT THE CAKE & CARRY ON without him.

News from your local community Police Officer...

Over the last few months we have had several reports from members of the public who have received calls from persons purporting to be Police Officers.

The supposed Police Officers give their name, a collar number (they have called it a badge number on occasion), a Police Station, will say something about your bank account being compromised, you can help catch them and will then ask for your bank details, talk about transferring it to a safe account or ask you to withdraw some money and a Police Officer will collect it.

The persons will try and rush you into a decision, they will say this is urgent and it needs to be done now and it can't wait.

ALL OF THIS IS A SCAM!

Every time you answer the phone be it a landline

or mobile, unless you know the caller please...

STOP! THINK! TAKE 5 MINUTES!

The Police will never ask you to do anything like this, nor will the bank or other organisations.

Never rush into anything you have been asked of by someone phoning you.

Please put the phone down and speak with a family member, neighbour or a person you trust.

As you are aware, the present trial of running the X51 Bus Service back through Winterbourne Steepleton, North Rew, South Rew, Martinstown and Mallards Green is being carried out during this summer's timetable period, May to September 2024: but this is only on a trial basis, full reinstatement being dependant on passenger numbers during the trial period.

This trial was achieved by you residents, along with your friends and families, contacting First Bus by post and email to request the trial: WELL DONE!!!

We all now need to go through a similar process to both say thank you to First Bus for carrying out the trial and to tell them how this has affected you, your friends, family, neighbours, etc.
